With great anticipation and excitement, the results from our Sharmans Cross Enterprise Challenge 2013 were shared with the children in assembly this week. The takings from each of our year groups business stalls has been counted up, the 'loans' paid back and profits calculated...with Year 3 Star Beads Business coming out on top with an impressive £520.51. Altogether, the children from Year 3 to 6 made profits in excess of £1000 (Yr6 - £206.44, Yr5 - £202.80, Yr4 - £133.34 - not bad for 7-11 year olds in 3 hours of trading!
